Dear Parents,

Welcome back after the half term break.

We have already started well this half term and there is some wonderful work happening across the school. Badger class have been designing biscuits and have plans to use the 3D printer to produce Christmas decorations; Fieldmice have been learning all about ice and have their own igloo and Squirrel class have been working hard on number bonds and learning all about the legend of how the turtle cracked his shell. 
