Dear Parent/Carer,

Summer has finally arrived! It has been a glorious couple of days this week after a wet and cold start. I was delighted to be able to accompany Hedgehog class on their educational visit to Harry Potter Studios on Monday. The weather wasn't perfect but we were inside for the vast majority of the day! The children were magnificently well behaved and learnt a great deal. Well done and thanks to the staff who organised and ran the visit, in particular to Miss Luddy and Mrs Crisp.

It was really pleasing to see the learning reflected in Hedgehog Class later in the week when describing Bertie Bott's Every Flavour Beans – some poor children had dirt flavour; I was lucky to have banana. I was showing Cambridgeshire's Service Director for Education round the school at the time and he commented positively not just about this lesson but the manner of learning and behaviour across the school.
