Dear Families.

Welcome back after the half term break. It has been great to see everyone this week and thank you for so many positive comments regarding the school and the staff at the recent parent evenings. Lockdown

Next week we will be having a lockdown practice at the school. This involves the children coming into the school sitting quietly on the carpet in their classrooms, locking all the doors, closing all the windows and blinds. We often have a fire alarm to evacuate the children, this is an invacuation procedure that locks the school down. We do this regularly throughout the year and will talk about it to the children beforehand.

As you are aware, we have had some unwelcome visitors of the vermin kind this week but I am glad to inform you that there has been no rat activity on any of my school inspections in the morning and we will remain vigilant.

One area I would ask for your help with though pertains to a plea I put in my last newsletter that hasn't necessarily been adhered to.
