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# **HEADTEACHER'S NOTE**

Dear Parents/Carers,

November seems to have flown by and already we are in the preparations for Christmas. The Christmas service is being organised, the class hampers are starting to build up (please see your class teacher for information), the school are learning songs for the December production, cards have been made and delivered and the PTFA are working hard on events leading up to the end of term.

This Friday sees the first of these events. There will be a cake sale in the playground (or the group room if wet) after school. If families could bring cakes to sell Friday morning it would be great – nut free where possible please. The PTFA are asking for donations towards the cakes, there is no pricing, pay whatever you feel the cakes are worth! The profits from the cake sale will go directly to fund a music performance and workshop next term which costs £200. Also on Friday we have our termly book sale. Those who have been saving will be able to chose books in the afternoon before there is a open book sale to everyone from 3pm until 3.45pm. There are some fantastic books at a reduced price that we feel offer great value and the children will enjoy.

Another way of making a difference is by signing up the school as your charity preference with your Co-op card. 1% of all the purchases made at the Co-op goes towards their chosen charities of the year, this year we are one of them so don't forget to add us as your chosen charity!

It has already been a busy half term, Brian Moses came in earlier this month and we had a marvelous couple of days with him. The family writing evening was great fun and the children enjoyed working with and listening to Brian the following day. He was impressed with the poetry the children were producing and even published one year six's work on his blog! #### Attendance and the School Day

Please can you ensure that your child/ren arrive at school at the correct time in the morning and are collected promptly at the end of the school day. School opens at 8.40am and registration is at 8.50am. If children arrive after 8.50am please bring them in the front door to sign in. If they get here after the register has been done then this counts as an absence for attendance figures. We will be sending out attendance letters tomorrow to parents of all pupils whose attendance is below 95%.

School finishes at 3.15pm for all children in Years R, 1 and 2 and at 3.20pm for those in Years 3 - 6. We know that sometimes there are exceptional circumstances which mean parents are occasionally late to collect their children but we do provide an after school club Mondays to Thursdays so if you are not going to be able to collect your child on time please book them into Discovery Club. If children are not collected on time and we have not received a message from parents to say they are arriving imminently then they will be asked to join Discovery Club whilst attempts are made to contact parents. A charge will be made for the time spent in Discovery Club.

# **Keeping Safe**

Please can we remind you that children should not be using the play equipment before and after school. We have also noticed some children climbing the trees near to the kitchen door after school. Please can you ensure that children are kept with you in the playground at pick up time and are not allowed to climb the trees. Finally can we remind you that bikes should not be ridden on the school premises, please dismount and mount bicycles outside the gate and wheel bikes when on the premises. Thank you.
