1. Introduction

All local authorities (LAs) are required to formulate a scheme to coordinate admissions during the normal admissions round to maintained primary schools (including academies but excluding maintained special schools and maintained nursery schools) within their area.

- **Peterborough:** Will notify the Secretary of State for Education by 28 February 2025 that agreement to its coordinated scheme for admissions has been secured and will provide a copy.
- **Cambridgeshire:** Will notify the Secretary of State for Education by 28 February 2025 that agreement to its coordinated scheme for admissions has been secured and will provide a copy.

Under the coordinated scheme:

- The LA, as the admission authority, will set and apply the oversubscription criteria for all maintained community and voluntary controlled schools.
- Academies, voluntary aided, free, and foundation schools will set and apply their own oversubscription criteria.

2. Aims of the Primary Scheme

Coordination schemes are intended to:

- Simplify the admissions process.
- Reduce the likelihood of any child being left without a school place.
- Ensure, as far as is reasonably practicable, that every parent of a child living in a local authority area who has applied to a maintained school is sent a single offer of a school place by their local authority.

Coordination schemes do not affect the rights and duties of the governing bodies of voluntary aided and foundation schools to set and apply their own admission arrangements and oversubscription criteria, nor for academies and free schools to agree their own arrangements with the Secretary of State. Admission authorities do not have to determine the same or similar oversubscription criteria but must ensure that their own arrangements are compatible with, and do not undermine, the coordination scheme for their area.

These arrangements are required to:

- Meet all statutory requirements relating to the coordinated admissions process.
 - Ensure that the needs of the child and the wishes of the parent(s) are the prime considerations.
 - Ensure that as many parents as possible gain a place for their child at one of their preferred schools.
 - Ensure that every child living in the LA area who has applied for a school place in the normal admission round is issued with an offer letter on the agreed offer letter date.
 - Specify how late applications should be dealt with and how applications that fall outside of the normal admission round should be dealt with.
 - Ensure that all parties to the admissions process work together to achieve the above aims, within the limits of the legislation relating to school admissions.

3. Scope of the Scheme

This scheme applies to all maintained, community, voluntary controlled, voluntary aided, foundation, and academy primary schools within the ACT Multi Academy Trust, including those located in the Peterborough City Council and Cambridgeshire County Council areas. The scheme ensures a fair, transparent, and consistent process for the allocation of school places across all ACT schools.

4. Application Process

4.1 Composite Prospectus and Parental Guidance

- Both authorities ensure that the prospectus is accessible to all parents, including those who may not have internet access, by providing hard copies on request.
 - The prospectus is also distributed to Early Years Settings and Infant/Primary schools to support parents of children due to start or transfer to school the following September.

4.2 Application Forms

- **Online applications** are strongly encouraged via the relevant local authority's admissions portal.
 - **Paper forms** are available for parents/carers unable to access the online facility.
 - The **common application form** collects all required data, including:
 - Child's legal name, date of birth, address, and telephone number
 - Applicant details (parent/carer)
 - Current or previous school (where applicable)
 - Sibling details (if relevant)
 - Whether the child is or was a Child in Care (CiC/PCiC), or has an Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP)

4.3 Preferences

- Parents may express a **preference for up to three schools**, ranking them in order.
 - **Equal Preference System:** All preferences are treated equally; the order does not affect the ranking by oversubscription criteria.
 - Parents are encouraged to provide reasons for their preferences, but this is not mandatory.

4.4 Supplementary Information Forms (SIFs)

- Some own admission authority schools (e.g., academies, voluntary aided, foundation schools) may require a **Supplementary Information Form (SIF)** to collect additional information necessary for applying the school's oversubscription criteria (e.g., church attendance).
- **SIFs must not request:**
 - Personal details about parents/families (e.g., maiden names, criminal convictions, marital or financial status)
 - Any financial contribution, voluntary or otherwise
 - Details of parents' achievements, educational background, or whether either the parents' or the child's first language is English
 - Details about parents' or children's disabilities, special educational needs, or medical conditions
 - Parents' or children's interests, hobbies, or membership of societies
 - Agreement to support the ethos of the school in a practical way
 - Both parents to sign the form, or for the child to complete the form
- Information on which schools require a SIF is provided in the prospectus/guidance and available for download from the LA website and from the school.

4.5 Submission of SIFs

- All parents applying to a school requiring a SIF must also complete the **common application form** (online or paper).
- **SIFs must be returned directly to the school** being applied for by the national closing date (15 January 2026).
- Any SIFs submitted to the LA will be date-stamped and forwarded to the relevant school.

5. Submission Deadlines and Late Applications

- **On-time applications** are those received by the LA or a school by the deadline.
- **Late applications** are processed after all on-time applications have been allocated, in rounds, according to the published timetable.
- **Proof of address** may be requested at the data processing stage.
- **Changes after the closing date** are only permitted for genuine reasons (e.g., change of address, siblings changing schools). A second deadline applies for such changes, as specified in the admissions timetable.
- Parents wishing to amend preferences after the closing date must complete a "Change of Preference" Form. The new application replaces any previous application.

6. Special Circumstances

- Both authorities comply with the School Admissions Code regarding children of UK Service Personnel and families moving into the area.

7. Allocation of Places

- **Preferences are ranked** by each school’s published oversubscription criteria.
- **Own admission authority schools** (academies, voluntary aided, foundation) return ranked lists to the LA.
- **Allocation process:**

Scenario	Allocation Process
1st preference met	Place allocated, lower preferences disregarded
2nd preference met	Place allocated, child on waiting list for 1st preference
3rd preference met	Place allocated, child on waiting lists for 1st and 2nd preferences
None met	Place allocated at nearest school with availability; child on waiting lists for all preferences

- **Cross-boundary coordination:** The LA will, wherever possible, take account of higher preference offers that can be made by another local authority, ensuring children receive the highest possible preference available across LA boundaries.

8. Offer Letters

- **Single offer** issued per child.
- Offer letter/email includes:
 - The name of the school at which a place has been offered
 - Reasons for refusing the child at any of their preference schools (if applicable)
 - Information about the right to appeal against any refusal
- **Online applicants:** Confirmation of the offer is available via the admissions portal after the National Offer Date.
- **Paper applicants:** Offer letters are sent by post.

9. Reply to Offer

- Parents are required to **accept or decline** the allocation of a school place within **10 school days** of the offer being sent or posted.
- During this period, the allocated school will attempt to contact parents to confirm acceptance or refusal.
- If no response is received within the specified period, the LA will send a reminder letter. If, after a further period, no decision is received, the place may be withdrawn and offered in the next round of allocations.

10. Declining or Refusing Offers

- Parents should **not decline or refuse** the offer of a place unless they are certain of a place at an alternative school.
- Declining an offer does **not remove the parent's right of appeal** for any school at which a place has been refused, but ensures that all children have a school place.

11. Coordination After Allocation Day

- After the National Offer Date (16 April 2026), parents must continue to apply to their **home local authority** for late applications for the normal admissions round (i.e., between 16/17 April and 31 August for reception and junior/middle transfer).
- This process ensures that places which become available are reallocated effectively and duplicate offers are avoided.

12. Waiting Lists

- **Waiting lists** are held in strict oversubscription criteria order, as used for initial allocations.
- After the National Offer Date, there is **no distinction between “on-time” and “late” applications** on waiting lists.
- Schools must notify the LA when a place becomes available. The LA will offer the place to the child at the top of the waiting list at the time of allocation.
- If a child is offered a place at a lower preference school and a place becomes available at a higher preference school, the original offer will be withdrawn and a new offer made, unless the parent informs the LA to remove them from the higher preference school's waiting list.
- If a parent wishes their child to be considered for an alternative school after the offer date, a new application form must be completed listing the new order of preferences.

13. Appeals

- Parents are informed of their **right of appeal** against any refusal and to whom to appeal.
- Deadlines for submitting appeal forms are provided in the admissions timetable to ensure appeals are heard within **40 school days**.
- Places declined by parents are allocated to those on the waiting list in order of ranking.
